2017 Dobell Exhibition Grant

The 2017 round of the Dobell Exhibition Grant was assessed on 20 October 2016 by a three member panel consisting of:

- Paula Latos-Valier, Art Director, Sir William Dobell Art Foundation
- Michelle Belgiorno, Trustee, Sir William Dobell Art Foundation
- Rachel Arndt, Gallery Programs and Touring Exhibitions Manager, Museums & Galleries of NSW

The panel assessed nine applications from regional galleries and arts centres across NSW. A diverse and competitive round of high quality exhibition proposals was received.

After significant discussion, the Panel unanimously decided to award the Dobell Exhibition Grant to two recipients, each recipient receiving \$20,000. The Panel felt both exhibition proposals and accompanying public and educational programs - although very different - equally embodied the aims of the program in unique ways: To support artists, extend public appreciation and engagement with the visual arts and expand curatorial skills and creativity.

The panel commented that it is essential that applicants provide clear and relevant visual material to support the written exhibition proposal, within the guidelines. They also advised that it is important that galleries clearly articulate the links between listed works that have been proposed for exhibition and the curatorial or thematic premise as often these links are not clearly evident in the application. The panel also re-iterated that proposed exhibitions should be supported by innovative public and education programs that creatively engage both artists and the community.
